Assessments

Per district policy, a 60% is proficient. However, any Mid-unit or final unit assessment earning 60% or below and the student meets the *Retake criteria, qualifies for an Assessment Retake in SAGE.

Cheating on an assessment earns a score of F/59% and does not meet the Retake Criteria.

Talking during tests and quizzes does not meet the Retake criteria. However, a student talking during a test or quiz can complete a Test Correction for a half a point each missed problem if the student scored a 60% or below.

A student not meeting the Retake criteria and scores a 60% or lower on a Unit or Mid-Unit assessment does meet the Test Correction criteria. Students correct each incorrect question and can earn a half a point for each correct answer. These half points will be added to their Unit or Mid-Unit assessment score.
