On January 15, 1929, Martin Luther King was born in Atlanta, Georgia. While growing up, Martin had a hard life. He was discriminated against because he had a darker skin color. From a young age, Martin believed in God and, when he was 25, he became a pastor for the Dexter Avenue Baptist Church in Montgomery, Alabama. Later on, he started his journey as a civil rights leader.
