Science is a hands-on laboratory class. You will be doing many laboratory activities which emphasize the use of hazardous chemical. Safety in the science classroom is the #1 priority for students, teachers, and parents. To ensure a safe science classroom, a list of rules has been developed and provided to you in this student safety contract. The rules must be followed at all times. Two copies of the contract are provided. One copy must be signed by both you and a parent or guardian before you can participate in the laboratory. The second copy is to be kept in your science notebook as a constant

25. Deepen the depth of a laboratory activity. Long hair, dangling jewelry, and loose clothing are a hazard in the laboratory. Long hair must be tied back and dangling jewelry and loose clothing must be secured. Shoes must completely cover the foot. No sandals allowed.
26. Lab apron has been provided for you to use and should be worn during laboratory activities.

ACCIDENT AND INJURY

27. Report an accident (spill, leakage, etc.) or injury (cut, burn, etc.) of the instructor immediately, no matter how trivial it may appear.
28. If you or your lab partner are hurt, immediately yell "Code one, Code one" or get help in the classroom.
29. If a chemical splashes on you or your skin, immediately flush with running water from the eye wash station for at least 20 minutes. No ifs, ands, or buts.
30. When meeting the momentary Tm(25.4/minute)

HANDLING CHEMICAL

31. All chemicals in the laboratory are to be considered dangerous. Do not touch, taste, or smell any chemical unless specifically instructed to do so. The proper technique for smelling chemicals will be demonstrated to you.
32. Check the label on chemical bottles before removing any of the contents. Take only as much chemical as you need.
33. Never eat, drink, or use original containers.
